Leader:

- 6. For our deceased relatives and friends, that all those who have died may live forever in the radiant glory of our God. We pray ...

Leader:

Loving God, you yourself are mercy and compassion. Hear these prayers we bring before you, as well as the ones we hold in the silence of our hearts, so that our prayer, fasting and abstinence may be pleasing to you.
