# **CONVERSATION STARTERS**

Now more than ever the domestic Church is activated in the preparation of youth for Sacraments. As partners in faith, parents and sponsors are encouraged to engage in conversations of faith to help nurture young people in their formation for Sacraments.

Here are some conversation starters to get the ball rolling:

Who do you think the Holy Spirit is?

God gives many gifts to us through the Holy Spirit. Which gift do you see at work in your life? What's one gift that you need right now?

What are some questions that you might have about your Confirmation?

How do you think God is calling you to serve the Church? How can I help you do this?

In addition to questions, it is important that parents and sponsors share their own experience of lived faith. Witnessing to the daily joys and struggles of faithfulness is important to a child's experience of Christ alive and striving for everyday holiness.

- Daily Prayer
- Mealtime Conversations about Faith
- Sunday Eucharist
- Volunteering Time and Talent to the Parish Community
- Spending quality time with your chosen sponsor

"Anyone called to be a guide to young people must appreciate the little flame that continues to burn. The ability to discern pathways where others only see walls, to recognize potential.
