**INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT ON THE SUMMARY FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

To His Excellency, the Bishop of Hamilton

The accompanying summary financial statements, which comprise the summary combined balance sheet as at December 31, 2016, and the summary combined statements of revenue and expenditures and changes in fund balances for the year then ended, and related notes, are derived from the audited financial statements of The Roman Catholic Episcopal Corporation of the Diocese of Hamilton in Ontario (the Diocese) for the year ended December 31, 2016. We expressed a qualified audit opinion on those financial statements in our auditors' report dated May 23, 2017 (see below).

The summary financial statements do not contain all the disclosures required by Canadian accounting standards for not for profit organizations applied in the preparation of the audited financial statements of The Roman Catholic Episcopal Corporation of the Diocese of Hamilton in Ontario. Reading the summary financial statements, therefore, is not a substitute for reading the audited financial statements of The Roman Catholic Episcopal Corporation of the Diocese of Hamilton in Ontario.

**Management's Responsibility for the Summary Financial Statements**

Management is responsible for the preparation of a summary of the audited financial statements in accordance with the criteria outlined in the *Notes* to the summary financial statements.

**Auditors' Responsibility**

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the summary financial statements based on our procedures, which were conducted in accordance with Canadian Auditing Standard (CAS) 810, "Engagements to Report on Summary Financial Statements."

**Opinion**

The summary financial statements are qualified to the equivalent extent as the audited financial statements of The Roman Catholic Episcopal Corporation of the Diocese of Hamilton in Ontario as at December 31, 2016. The qualification of the audited financial statements is described in our qualified audit opinion in our report dated May 23, 2017. Our qualified opinion is based on the fact that, in common with many not-for-profit organizations, the Organization derives revenue from contributions from the public and fundraising, the completeness of which is not susceptible to satisfactory audit verification. Accordingly, our verification of these revenues was limited to the amounts recorded in the records of the Organization and we were not able to determine whether any adjustments might be necessary to revenue, excess of revenue over expenditures, assets and net assets. In addition, some capital asset acquisitions and disposals were treated as operating items.

The preparation of these summary financial statements requires management to determine the information that needs to be reflected in them so that they are consistent in all material respects with, or represent a fair summary of, the audited financial statements.

Management prepared these summary financial statements using the following criteria:

- (a) the summary financial statements include a statement for each statement included in the audited financial statements with the exception that management determined that the statement of cash flows does not provide additional useful information and as such has not included them as part of the summary financial statements;
- (b) information in the summary financial statements agrees with the related information in the audited financial statements;
- (c) major subtotals, totals and comparative information from the audited financial statements are included; and
- (d) the summary financial statements contain the information from the audited financial statements dealing with matters having a pervasive or otherwise significant effect on the summarized financial statements. Copies of the audited financial statements are available at the Diocesan Chancery office.
