THE CANADIAN CATHOLIC ORGANIZATION FOR DEVELOPMENT AND PEACE sent us an update report on the emergency collection for Syria which took place during the summer months. To date the collection from Canadian Dioceses totalled \$1,827,751.24. The amount from Hamilton Diocese equalled \$144,586.17. If any Parishes have not yet forwarded their collection to the Chancery, please do so now. It is never too late to support this important cause.
