PLEASE NOTE: THE NATIONAL COLLECTION FOR THE PHILIPPINES, which was initiated by Archbishop Paul Andre Durocher, President of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops, and is being sponsored through the Canadian Catholic Organization for Development and Peace (D&P) is authorized to take place in the Parishes and missions of the Diocese of Hamilton. The Government of Canada has announced that funds sent to recognized charities before December 9, 2013, to assist the Philippines will be matched "dollar for dollar". D&P is one of those recognized charities. Parishioners are invited to contribute through their Parish special collection (receipts can be given from the Parish if you note your envelope number with your contribution). Monies collected in the Parishes are to be forwarded in their entirety to the Chancery no later than December 3. The funds will be forwarded in their entirety to D&P offices from the Diocese no later than December 6 to ensure that the government matching grant will apply. Alternatively, parishioners may wish to make their contribution directly to D&P. D&P has "Emergency" envelopes but a notation that the offering is for the Philippines should be written on the envelope. Call 905-528-0770 for envelopes. In this instance, receipts for the contribution will come directly from D&P. In addition to our financial support, we add our prayers for those who are suffering in the midst of this disaster!
