This will ensure that the monies are sent to *Development and Peace* in time for matching grants from the Federal Government. MORE THAN 40 PARISHES IN THE DIOCESE HAVE EXPRESSED INTEREST in welcoming Syrian refugees. Erin Pease, Director of our Refugee Office, has visited many Deaneries and a few individual Parishes to explain the three Government programs we promote and support. She will help navigate the application processes where necessary. Once we receive our 2016 quota from the Government, the real work will start.

THE DIOCESAN OFFICES FOR REFUGEES, JUSTICE AND PEACE AND YOUTH MINISTRY have developed a Youth Ministry Resource for Advent 2015. *I Was a Stranger And You Welcomed Me*, complements beautifully the recent pastoral letter from the CCCB Justice and Peace Commission with the same title. Both are powerful reflections on our current refugee crisis and the need for prayerful solidarity with our vulnerable brothers and sisters. THE CCCB OFFICE FOR EVANGELIZATION AND CATECHESIS (OEC) has published a newsletter for catechists across the country. The first edition of *ENCOUNTER* is focused on evangelization and catechesis of children, youth and families. The same office has also published a newsletter providing ideas and resources for diocesan directors of adult faith formation in the planning and development of programs. *ON GOOD SOIL* takes its name from the book published a few years ago by the Episcopal Commission for Evangelization which promoted adult catechesis. CULTIVATING AND CARING FOR CREATION IS A 12-PART PROGRAM prepared by Green Spirit Television and sponsored by the Justice and Peace Commission of the CCCB. The video-based program is perfect for Parishes wanting to study Pope Francis' encyclical *Laudato Si'*. The Diocesan Offices of Discipleship and Catechesis can help you acquire this resource and guide you in how best to use it.
