ON FEBRUARY 29, 1856, POPE PIUS IX SIGNED A PAPAL DECREE forming the Diocese of Hamilton. On the same day, he signed a decree appointing Bishop John Farrell the first Bishop of the new Diocese. On Sunday, February 28th, the 11 a.m. Mass at the Cathedral Basilica in Hamilton will be celebrated in thanksgiving for the blessings of God over the past 160 years. Archbishop Luigi Bonazzi, Apostolic Nuncio to Canada, will preach the homily at the Mass. On Monday, at 11:45 a.m., the actual date of the Anniversary, a Mass of Thanksgiving will be celebrated, followed by a reception in McNally Hall at the Cathedral. All Masses are public events. All are welcome.

ON SATURDAY EVENING, FEBRUARY 27th, a dinner honouring Archbishop Luigi Bonazzi is being held in McNally Hall. This is the first visit of the Apostolic Nuncio to Canada since his appointment on December 18, 2013. Born in Bergamo, Italy, in 1948, he entered the diplomatic service on March 25, 1980. He has served in the Cameroons, Trinidad and Tobago, Malta, Mozambique, Spain, the United States of America, Italy and Canada. He has served as Apostolic Nuncio to Haiti, Cuba, the Baltic Countries (Lithuania and Estonia), and later including Latvia, prior to his arrival here. We warmly welcome His Grace to Canada, and wish him a pleasant visit to Hamilton.

DR. KEVIN SMITH, PRESIDENT AND CEO OF ST. JOSEPH'S HEALTH SYSTEM, will be invested as a Knight of St. Gregory the Great, during the Sunday morning 11 a.m. Mass at the Cathedral Basilica. Archbishop Bonazzi will confer the honour granted by Pope Francis earlier this year. We offer congratulations to Dr. Smith, both for the honour bestowed and for the service he gives to healthcare through St. Joe's!

THE FUNERAL OF MONSIGNOR WILLIAM (BILL) O'BRIEN took place at St. Patrick's Parish in Hamilton, on Thursday, which has been the center of worship for his family for years. Bishop John Sherlock, Bishop-emeritus of London, and long-time friend, preached a wonderful homily that reflected the Gospel roots of his ministry over his long life. May Monsignor O'Brien rest in peace and obtain the reward promised to good and faithful servants!
