FATHER MICHAL KRUSZEWSKI, C.R., succeeds Father Wayne Lobsinger as our Diocesan Representative on the Canadian Federation of Diocesan Presbyteral Councils. The Federation draws together Priests from across Canada to reflect on concerns related to priestly ministry. Their National Assembly this Fall will take place in Hamilton! Thanks to both Priests for their generous service to the Diocese and to the Federation.

THE MOVING FORWARD TOGETHER CAMPAIGN used funds donated from Hamilton Diocese in the following way: \$40,000 for the *Indigenous Student Support Fund* and \$100,000 for *Gathering Place* at the Mohawk Community College; \$45,000 for the Life Long Care project of the Hamilton Regional Indian Centre; \$60,000 for the development of *Firekeepers* (trauma support and suicide prevention) in Maliseet territory, New Brunswick; \$30,000 for Indigenous leadership in identification of and development of appropriate projects and \$25,000 yet to be distributed. This is how our support for the Catholic Entities fundraising campaign was used.

THE GOVERNING COUNCIL OF THE CATHOLIC HEALTH ALLIANCE OF CANADA approved the application and welcomed St. Joseph's Health System as a Member of the Alliance on May 4th. President Michael Shea announced the good news to Sr. Anne Anderson, CSJ, Chair of the Board of Directors of the SJHS in a recent letter. It is important that Catholic healthcare institutions are closely aligned, especially during the current serious concerns for healthcare providers.

THE GOOD SHEPHERD MINISTRIES IN HAMILTON celebrated their 5577 volunteers at a recent dinner. They represent 79,000 hours of service, assuring the high quality of care provided by the Brothers of St. John of God and their faithful supporters. One gentleman was honoured for volunteering at the men's night shelter for 40 years! Corporal works of mercy indeed!
