The application to sponsor the family was submitted in 2010. Two sisters and their families, who have been living in asylum in Pakistan, will soon be joining their brother (the sponsor) in Hamilton. When he received the good news he wrote: "On behalf of my family and myself, I would like to thank the Diocese of Hamilton and the Government of Canada for all of their efforts and hard work for making this possible to bring my family to Canada. It is greatly appreciated by all of us and I know that they will contribute to keep this country always great. May God bless us all!"

THE MARCH 18th WORKSHOP HOSTED BY THE OFFICE FOR REFUGEES, announced in last week's Heart to Heart, has been organized for Pastors and parishioners *already involved* in the BVOR Program. We are planning to welcome approximately 75 participants. The workshop will take place at St. Anthony Daniel Parish in Kitchener.

THE FORMATION OF CANDIDATES FOR THE PERMANENT DIACONATE continues this Saturday at the Chancery. Sister Eileen Schuller, OSU, Professor of Religious Studies at McMaster University, will speak about The Prophets to the Year One candidates, and Mr. Michael Chow, former Chaplain at St. Mary's Hospital, Kitchener, will speak to the Year Three candidates about Pastoral Theology: The Sick and Dying. Father Jim Petrie, Pastor of St. Benedict Parish in Milton, will celebrate the Mass in the Annunciation Chapel. Dean Stephane Zara will present on Prison Ministry. We pray for our Permanent Deacon candidates.

THE RITE OF ELECTION TAKES PLACE ON SUNDAY AT 1:30 PM at both the Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King in Hamilton and the Basilica of Our Lady Immaculate in Guelph. 100 Catechumens from 35 Parishes in the Diocese will "sign in" and be formally declared "The Elect". In the coming weeks they will intensify their preparation for the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist, which will be celebrated in their Parishes at the Easter Vigil. Pray for them – it is a big step in their lives and a blessing for the whole Church!
