THE BODIES OF BISHOP JOHN FARRELL AND BISHOP PETER CRINNON, the first and second Bishops of Hamilton respectively, were translated from the basement of St. Mary's Church in downtown Hamilton and interred at Holy Sepulchre Cemetery in Burlington, earlier this week. The move brings five of the seven deceased Bishops of Hamilton to the same location in the cemetery, beside Holy Sepulchre Chapel. Memorial stones, marking the graves, will be erected in the coming months. A third body, Father Hugh Kelly, was moved to the Priests' plot at the same time. Thanks to Mr. John O'Brien and Mr. Paul Dermody for assuring a respectful and prayerful transfer.

**FATHER FRANCISCO CRUZ HAS BEEN APPOINTED A MISSIONARY OF MERCY**, following the death of Father Ted Hughes. Archbishop Rino Fisichella, President of the Pontifical Council for the Promotion of the New Evangelization informed us of the appointment by Pope Francis earlier this month. Father Cruz will join Father Bill Trusz and Father Michael King at a special gathering of Missionaries of Mercy with Pope Francis, scheduled for April 8-11, 2018, to coincide with the celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday. We congratulate Father Cruz on this honour, and thank him for his readiness to accept the appointment.
