THE FUNERAL MASS FOR MONSIGNOR EDWARD HOUSE took place yesterday morning at the Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King. Monsignor died on Holy Thursday, his 71<sup>st</sup> birthday, in the care of his sisters. Bishops, Priest-friends and collaborators gathered with his family and a church full of friends and former parishioners from the Parishes he served, including the Cathedral where he was Rector for 13 years. The sorrow was heart-felt; the promises of the Easter season gave hope! May he rest in the peace of Christ!

FROM POPE FRANCIS ON GOD'S MERCY AND FORGIVENESS: "One time the image of Our Lady of Fatima came to Buenos Aires and there was a Mass for the sick in a big stadium of people. "If God did not forgive everything," she answered, "the world would not exist." I wanted to ask her, "Did you study at the Gregorian University?"!
