WORLD MISSION SUNDAY is celebrated this Sunday, October 20<sup>th</sup>! This year it is marked in the context of the Extraordinary Mission Month which was inaugurated by Pope Francis on October 1<sup>st</sup>. "The missionary mandate touches us personally: I am a mission, always; you are a mission, always; every baptized man and woman is a mission. People in love never stand still: they are drawn out of themselves; they are attracted and attract others in turn; they give themselves to others and build relationships that are life-giving. As far as God's love is concerned, no one is useless or insignificant. Each of us is a mission to the world, for each of us is the fruit of God's love!"
