THE 2020 PENTECOST MESSAGE FROM THE CCCB – Standing Committee for Relations with Movements and Associations was released this week by the Conference. THANKS TO THE FINANCIAL RESULTS OF THE *ONE HEART ONE SOUL* CAMPAIGN in the *pilot* and *first* wave Parishes, and the reopening of some businesses following the pandemic shutdown, some Pastors have been authorized to begin approved renovation projects. Father Wayne Lobsinger, St. Ann Parish in Ancaster, has undertaken a major update of the interior of the church. A new ceramic floor in the nave and sanctuary, strengthening of the choir loft for the return of the organ, a fresh paint job, all done without disruption during the continuing shutdown of the Parish. Similarly, Father David Wynen, completed an LED lighting project in McNally Hall at the Cathedral Basilica which both brightens the hall and reduces hydro expenses. AT THE BASILICA OF OUR LADY IMMACULATE IN GUELPH, there was a huge sigh of relief yesterday. The City issued the long-awaited *Certificate of Occupancy* for the renovated Parish residence and offices. The long-awaited move began yesterday. In the coming weeks, landscaping will be completed, giving the new facility a new "feel" for *The Hill*! Thanks to Msgr. Dennis Noon, for beginning the process, to Father Ian Duffy for seeing it through, and to Joe Finochio for overseeing the entire effort! A job well done!

WITH THE ANNOUNCEMENT from the Ontario Government on Wednesday past, the Chancery Office will remain CLOSED until June 9<sup>th</sup>. Mr. Jim Long, Chancellor-Temporal Affairs, announced the ongoing closure to Diocesan personnel in an e-mail on May 27<sup>th</sup>. He also informed staff that guidelines for the reopening of our Diocesan Offices are being developed and will be communicated to them in an upcoming teleconference. We look forward to the "new normal"!
