THE REEL JUSTICE FILM FESTIVAL is back for another year! A partnership between the Bishop Farrell Library & Archives and the Canadian Catholic Organization for Development and Peace (CCODP) shines a spotlight on issues of social, political, and economic injustice. NET CANADA HAS PUBLISHED THEIR ANNUAL REPORT featuring the good works of the *National Evangelization Teams (NET)* throughout Canada! "Jesus, the light of the world, is very much alive and still changing the lives of young people across Canada!" ONE HEART ONE SOUL CAMPAIGN is launching its third wave in the largest group of Parishes yet during the coming weeks. The successful campaign has not only raised millions of dollars for long-awaited parish projects, but it has also stimulated parish life throughout the Diocese — even amidst the COVID-19 pandemic lockdown. Parish teams have been prepared and will soon be making their important calls to parishioners. The generosity of parishioners to their Parishes has lifted our hearts! THE CATHEDRAL BASILICA is undergoing an upgrade of its "sound and lighting" capacity. The current lights are being refitted with LED lights, significantly reducing the watts required for each fixture. The television screens are being replaced with higher definition screens and new cameras, and the sound system is being overhauled. It should all be done before Palm Sunday and the Holy Week and Easter services. In the meantime, Masses are being celebrated in McNally Hall at 30% capacity.

THE FEAST OF THE CHAIR OF PETER is celebrated on Monday, February 22nd. "The cathedra is literally the seat of the bishop," said Pope Benedict XVI in 2006. "It is the symbol of his authority and, particularly, of his 'Magisterium,' in other words of the evangelical teaching that he, as successor the Apostles, is called to protect and transmit to the Christian community. To celebrate the 'Chair' of Peter means, then, giving it a strong spiritual significance, and recognizing therein a privileged sign of the love of God."
