**THE PERSONNEL BOARD** of the Diocese will hold its first meeting next week. The Deans participate in the first meeting of the Board and provide an overview of the personnel situation in each Deanery. THE FINAL MEETING OF THE FINANCE COUNCIL for 2021 takes place next week. The Council meets at least 10 times each year to assure the financial well-being of the Diocese. We are blessed to have committed members of the Council and a Chancellor (Temporal Affairs) who prepares the agenda and provides the documentation.

THE HAMILTON-WENTWORTH CATHOLIC DISTRICT SCHOOL BOARD holds its annual "initial" Board meeting "virtually" on Tuesday evening. Our Catholic schools are overseen by Catholic leaders who are committed to encourage and promote the best education in our communities. We pray for them.

**THE STATE BOARD AND DISTRICT DEPUTIES** of the Ontario State Council of the Knights of Columbus meet these days in Toronto. It is the first "in person" meeting in more than two years. Actually the meeting is "hybrid" because some will join the meeting online. The good works of the Knights have continued through the pandemic, but many of the Councils have cancelled "in person" meetings.
