THE DIOCESAN PARTNERSHIP WITH DAYTON UNIVERSITY begins a new path as we embark on a Diocesan-specific study entitled: *To Inform, Encourage and Heal: A Canadian Response in Light of the Residential School Crisis.* This study, developed by our own Diocesan team, aims to create a safe space and structure for Catholics with a desire to learn and dialogue about the realities of the history of Residential Schools and to discuss our shared responsibilities for reconciliation. The first round of participants, a trial cohort, begins their study on Monday, January 17th. Pray for them, and for our Diocesan facilitators who will accompany the learning.

WELL-FORMED AND CAPABLE MINISTERS are essential to celebrating our liturgies well. As we continue to rebuild post-COVID ministries, more than 175 ministers of the Word and Extraordinary ministers of Communion completed their formation during October and November in COVID-safe inperson sessions. The Liturgy Office was pleased to send mandates to Pastors of each successful minister during the month of December. Future sessions are paused until we can safely gather in-person. The Diocese is fortunate to have dedicated parishioners serving in all ministries. Thank you!
