It is an exciting time for parishioners who have waited a long time for their new church!

OUR PRAYERS GO OUT TO OUR UKRAINIAN BROTHERS AND SISTERS, especially those in the Ukraine, those displaced by the current conflict, and those of Ukrainian heritage here in Canada. We are mindful of the many refugees from diverse countries of origin who have been living in asylum in Ukraine. The UN Refugee Agency reports that more than 1 million refugees have fled Ukraine in recent days. Our Office for Refugees has already started fielding calls enquiring about sponsorship for Ukrainian nationals. The UN has confirmed it is too early to consider resettlement for those fleeing Russian aggression in Ukraine. Sponsorship is not currently a viable option for this community. We pray for a rapid de-escalation of violence and suffering and a generous humanitarian response in the interim. THE ASSEMBLY OF CATHOLIC BISHOPS OF ONTARIO meets virtually next week on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday mornings. This provides the Bishops opportunities to discuss matters of common concern and interest, and to receive reports and interventions from a variety of presenters. The ACBO has carefully overseen the development of pandemic protocols in the dioceses, with the help of a *WorshipSafe* committee. The professional counsel of medical expertise has been invaluable in assuring the care of parishioners throughout the pandemic.
