**THE** *NATIONAL ROSARY FOR THE FAMILY*, sponsored by the *CCCB Standing Committee for Family and Life*, will be prayed on Sunday, June 19<sup>th</sup>, beginning at 3:00 p.m. EDT (a time chosen to accommodate the various time zones across Canada). The nation-wide ZOOM prayer time is part of the preparation for the 19<sup>th</sup> World Meeting of Families (WMF) which will be held in Rome from June 22-26, 2022. **THE ANNUAL** *NOVENA TO ST. ANN* (July 18<sup>th</sup>-26<sup>th</sup>) will be hosted again this year by St. Ann Parish, Hamilton. The nine days of prayer will invoke the intercession of St. Ann, the Mother of the Blessed Virgin Mary and Grandmother of Jesus Christ. Mass will be celebrated each evening of the Novena at 7:00 p.m., with the Novena prayers said before the relic. The homilies will be part of our "*Faith in Stained Glass*" series highlighting nine of the stained-glass windows that beautify the church and artistically teach the faith. WORLD YOUTH DAY 2023 is scheduled to be held in Lisbon, Portugal, August 1<sup>st</sup>-6<sup>th</sup>, 2023! Diocesan Offices are already beginning to consider the benefits provided to young adults, 18 to 35 years-old, from our Diocese, who would participate in the event in person. They are also studying the possibility of gathering young people at a venue *within* the Diocese to join in the events virtually. At the invitation of the Holy Father, World Youth Day is a gathering of young adults from around the world to celebrate faith. "Mary Arose And Went With Haste" (Lk 1:39) is the theme chosen by Pope Francis. It highlights Mary as both a woman of charity and a missionary.
