Hamilton Mission Youth is an apostolate of Regnum Christi and the Legionaries of Christ. Inspired by the international Mission Youth organization, it was started in Hamilton two years ago. We focus on bringing youth together to serve the homeless, reach out to those in need, and volunteer wherever there is need. All of this is a joyful experience when done together with friends and a true Christian spirit of joy, love, and acceptance. More experienced youth get to lead those who are new as team leaders and help their peers have the best experience.

We focus especially on **encountering the other person in a deep way, listening with the heart, and treating with dignity and love**, like Mary as she visited her cousin Elizabeth. Hamilton Mission Youth has already done outreach in Hamilton, Oakville, Kitchener, Cambridge, and as far as Montreal.

The Chaplaincy at **Bishop Macdonell CHS** has been very vibrant this past year as we worked with students to make everyone feel that they are included and can take the lead to build a better world for tomorrow. We had retreats out at the St Brigid Villa on the Ignatius property at the north end of Guelph, where our Grade 9 students worked on team building and their call to be active disciples in the modern world. The Grade 10 students volunteered at a local food bank to restock shelves and make hot meals for delivery. Our Grade 11 students continued to examine different faith traditions and had the opportunity to tour many temples and a mosque. The grade twelve students were welcomed to St. Jerome's campus and offered a fantastic retreat and hospitality by the campus ministry as they looked to continue their faith in the next stage of their journey.

Throughout the year we celebrated monthly Masses in our chapel and reestablished a ministry of prayer and adoration before the Blessed Sacrament for our students. Adoration is offered 4 times throughout the year. The community of Bishop Mac is **very active in supporting the efforts of the community to support the marginalized in Guelph**.



Our Lady of the Assumption's Challenge & Conquest youth ministry was started earlier this year with the desire to get young people more involved in the faith community. With its vouth-led nature, the goal is to inspire them to grow in authentic faith and friendship with Christ and other Catholic youth. The program centres on gospel reflections, studying the the saints. team-building, Faith and community service projects, and encourages participation in the sacraments, such as at Mass and Adoration. Through these activities, a vibrant community of youth is formed, ready to listen to His voice and bring the Faith to life in various ways.

The group was **inspired by the work** done by the Sisters of the Poor of Jesus Christ in Hamilton, and worked to raise money to support their ministry through selling baked goods and sacrifice beads. Through the project, the youth showed great initiative, bringing more baked goods than we were able to fit on the table, as well as other homemade crafts to sell. It was held alongside a garage sale run by the Sisters and money was successfully raised to feed the poor and homeless in downtown Hamilton. This project was finished in only eight weeks since the group was started, speaking to the passion held by the group for serving those in need. Like Mary, when we heard of those in need, we gave up our time and energy to help to the best of our ability.

Most Blessed Sacrament Parish strives to take an intergenerational approach to our Youth Ministry Program. Our monthly Youth Group Nights for our middle-school age youth have been focusing on **"Shining Your Light"**; a time for understanding the call to be yourself as well as games and competitions.

In addition to our monthly Youth Group Events, we have been focusing family by holding bimonthly Family Events; where all ages come together in community to celebrate. Our annual Breakfast with Santa and our Pumpkin Carving Afternoon are an opportunity to bring people into the parish.

We are also grateful for the Legion of Mary and the CWL for co-sponsoring and facilitating Sacramental Preparation retreats, school visits, prayer opportunities for our schools and so much more.





Teenage Group

The Teenage group meets on First Saturdays of the Month with the Prayer and Faith formation activities. They lead many Marian Feast Celebrations: Profession. Rosary Martyrs Pilgrimage to Shrine. Midland, and in the Service of Acolyte durina the Sunday Celebration. With the help of CWL they participated in the "Into Life Series", "Youth Movie Nights" and helped out in the "Bible Summer Camp." This year they organized a major fundraiser for Chalice, raising \$9800.00 to provide support to a school for girls in Kenya.

Holy Cross Young Adults

We began the Holy Cross Young Adults group to help the continued faith formation and care for the Young Adults, - both married and single. We are now 34 members who meet regularly on 3rd Saturdays of the Month. We begin with the Holy Mass, continued with youth led adoration and faith formation sessions, along with the social activities. We support young people - immigrant students and workers, who come to our parish recently, encouraging them to participate in the life of the church. They discuss many important issues affecting young people with expression of the faith, relationship with family, work struggles, personal identity and discernment of the call of God. We have planned "All Saints Day Mass for Families and Children" and Plugged in - 2023" youth concert with Mass. Adoration and Faith Sharing.





SHIPWRECKED Bible Camp

Bible Camp is one of the biggest events of our youth ministry year, and this past summer we had a blast being "Shipwrecked" together and reflecting on Jesus as our great rescuer! Our participants met each day to pray together, explore stories from the Bible, play games, make crafts, try science experiments, and take on team challenges. We were very blessed to have a dedicated group of student and adult volunteers, without whom camp would not be possible, and to have lots of our former campers completing a leader-in-training program to help them prepare to be leaders next summer!

Youth Choir

Our youth choir is now in its 10th year and sings at our parish's Saturday evening Mass. We love connecting with God through the beauty of music and hearing the congregation praising Him along with us. We have lots of favourite hymns from the Glory & Praise and Catholic Book of Worship hymnals, and we also enjoy contemporary Christian songs!



Youth ministry programming at **St. Ambrose Church** is in full-swing! At the heart of this important ministry is helping young people to grow in relationship with Jesus, **helping them to discover their God-given gifts and talents**, exploring how to use those gifts and talents to serve, and growing in friendship with others!

St Ambrose Church has two youth groups. One for students in grades 6-8 and the other for students in grades 9-12. We are learning and growing in community through prayer, talks with priests and religious sisters, small group discussion, community-building activities, and field trips. Youth ministry is truly about faith, friendship, and fun!

Assumption College created an encounter initiative called: **Migrant Workers: Fratelli Tutti In Our Midst.** The Brant/Haldimand/Norfolk area employs approximately 5,000 temporary migrant agricultural workers each year from countries such as Guatemala, Jamaica, Trinidad, and Mexico which is the largest group of workers.


The objective of this project is to take an active role in Pope Francis' call to us in his encyclical, "Fratelli Tutti" (All Brothers) to actively facilitate the sense of belonging to one human family to the hearts and minds of ourselves and others around us and by understanding their culture, they may be seen as our brothers and sisters. This learning also makes us more accepting world citizens. We had a wonderful day visiting an organic farm, having conversations with the farm owners, migrant farm workers from Mexico, and people in the community who provide support to them. We shared culture by enjoying a delicious traditional Mexican meal together and connected in our Catholic faith and devotion to Mary through the beautiful story of St. Juan Diego and Our Lady of Guadalupe.

Assumption College was honoured to receive the Michael Carty Award and funding for this initiative from the Catholic Education Foundation of Ontario for this project lead by our chaplain Mrs. Debra Sheldrake and the student chaplaincy 180 Team and teacher Mrs. Manuela Torto and the Social Justice class in collaboration with the incredible staff of the Centre For Migrant Workers Solidarity. Our day was documented and a video created to raise awareness among high school students about the vital importance and significant contribution of temporary migrant workers to our agricultural industry and to our every day lives.



Frassati Leadership Program





The intention of this program is to call forward young Catholic leaders from across the Diocese of Hamilton, to equip them and encourage them to draw closer to Christ and their respective communities. The target age group for this program is individuals in grade ten (ages 15-16). The goal of this program is that young people will join us for opportunities for formation as Catholic leaders and then go back to their respective communities to turn their learning into practice.

Throughout the program, participants will focus on their own relationship with Christ and their community, while exploring what it means to be Catholic in today's world. Participants will engage in service opportunities through justice and advocacy work which we hope will inspire further contributions to their own communities and beyond.
