THE SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT is the annual Day of Prayer for Survivors and Victims of Sexual Abuse. The Vatican's Pontifical Commission for the Protection of Minors proposed a universal day of prayer in 2016. "In the experience of our members, victims/survivors have often expressed a desire for prayer as an important element in their healing process." Our Diocesan Liturgy Office has provided information and prayer resources to our parishes for Holy Hours, Liturgies of the Word, prayer intentions, Benediction, and Prayers of the Faithful. May these efforts support the paths of human and spiritual recovery not only for victims and survivors, but also for families and communities similarly affected.

**DIRECTORS AND COORDINATORS OF MUSIC**, Cantors, Musicians, and Choir members are invited and encouraged to participate in a *Music Ministers Retreat* on March 16, 2024, at Annunciation of Our Lord Parish in Hamilton. The session begins at 9:30 a.m. and continues to 3:00 p.m. **The facilitator for the day is Dr. Glenn Byer, and his theme: Near Occasions of Grace!** Dr. Byer is an award-winning author who has written widely on liturgical and pastoral ministry, including a series in *Today's Liturgy*. The day will begin with sung Morning Prayer, followed by four 45-minute sessions on *Transfiguring our Lives and Relationships through Sacred Music*.
