**CARDINAL GERALD CYPRIEN LACROIX** and Educator Linda Staudt facilitated this year's Priests' Seminar which focused on the Synodal experience as foundational in our Christian life. Both presenters participated in last year's Synod of Bishops on Synodality at the Vatican, Linda Staudt being one of 70 lay participants world-wide. They are preparing to return to Rome next month for part two of the Synod. The Priests focused on our own Diocesan synodal experience, *Forward Together In Christ*, presented by Bishop Wayne Lobsinger. It helped focus our appreciation of synodality, and it provides a roadmap for our ministry in the coming few years. The document will be available on our website on Wednesday next week. Hard copies will be available in our parishes. More than 90% of the Priests who serve in the Diocese participated in the three-day session, an opportunity to renew our fraternal ties and pastoral priorities.
