THE ANNUAL *MARCH FOR LIFE* in Ottawa, is on May 8th and 9th this year. This year's theme is *Protection at Conception* because human rights begin when human life begins, and human life begins at conception. THE NATIONAL LITURGY OFFICE, at our request, has changed the Liturgical Calendar (ORDO) to reflect that November 21 is the anniversary of Dedication of the Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King. It was on this date in 1982 that Bishop Paul Reding solemnly dedicated the Cathedral, which had previously been "blessed" in 1933, on December 19 by Bishop John McNally. The dedication anniversary is to be celebrated as a Solemnity in the Cathedral, and as a Feast in the rest of the Diocese.

APRIL 3RD IS REFUGEE RIGHTS DAY, a time to recognize the inherent dignity and rights of those forced to flee their homelands due to war, persecution, and violence. We are called to welcome the stranger, offer refuge to the displaced, and stand in solidarity with those seeking safety and hope. As a Sponsorship agreement Holder (SAH), our Diocese has been a beacon of Christ's love, working tirelessly to support refugees in rebuilding their lives with dignity and security. May we continue to be instruments of God's mercy, advocating for justice, compassion, and peace, so that all may live free from fear and persecution.
