Coordinate with Parish Leadership;

Speak with your parish priest and team to get support for hosting the event.

3

Select and Register for a Film from the schedule:

Choose a film that best aligns with community interests or upcoming parish events.

4

Set the location, we set the screening date:

Secure a space within your parish for the screening, e.g. a hall or meeting room.

5

Promote the event:

Use parish bulletins, social media, and word-of-mouth to invite parishioners and the local community to attend. You can also share information via email or community posters.

6

Prepare for the screening:

Arrange for technical equipment (computer, projector, sound system), snacks and ensure seating is comfortable for attendees. You will need Wi-Fi access to connect to the film and presentation.

7

Stay for the discussion:

After the film, consider organizing a group discussion or Q&A session to engage the audience with our guest speaker.
